I listened to the audio tape of the book, *The Wild Blue*, by Stephen E. Ambrose, Simon and Schuster, 2001, 8 cassettes, running time about 9 hours.

This is the story of George McGovern, his B-24, "The Dakota Queen", and his crew, and their part in winning WWII. Not a part of the story, McGovern later became U.S. Senator and presidential candidate. It is the complete story from enlistment at age 22,



through the 35 missions, to discharge. It gets very exciting with mission losses of 50%. We get to know him and his crew, his co-pilot who was killed on a mission, and the crews of some of the other B-24's. I found myself listening to more tapes in one sitting than I had intended.



I've recently read his Undaunted Courage, the story of the Lewis and Clark expedition and Nothing Like It In The World, the story of the first continental railroad, and I rate Ambrose as a very good historical author.
