

On February 16th, the ACE members and some Sun Prairie High School physics students met at Wisconsin Aviation. LTC (ret.) Bruce Fischer gave a presentation about the Air Force and the Air National Guard: career opportunities, education and training requirements, ordinance and aircraft. He also described his experiences as an F-16 pilot and as a commercial airline pilot. He said that flying military aircraft was exciting but that flying commercial aircraft was boring because of the automation built into the commercial airplanes.
