Attend the Chapter meeting on July 17th, 7 p.m. and YOU could be the one! (Invite new members and family to attend.)





### **Book Review**

"We Seven by the Astronauts Themselves," 1962, Simon & Schuster, 433 p. plus 19 p. photographs and 6 p. index, hardbound.

This is a very detailed, very interesting accounting of the first U.S. space flights, starting with short hops, continuing to globe orbiting flights leading up to but not including the moon landing. The first flights had the astronaut as a passenger, but later flights had the astronauts as pilots controlling such things as the number of orbits and the choice of landing sports, using controls similar to those of an airplane. They also had considerable input to the improvements in the design of future spacecraft. They did personal things, such as calling home while orbiting.

I found the book on the "free shelf" in the chapter clubhouse, and I shall return it at our next meeting.
