Located on the Poplar Grove Airport (C77) in northern Illinois, the Museum is on 12 acres and has several early 20th century airplane hangars and automotive garages which have been saved from destruction and relocated to their campus where they have been renovated for future generations to enjoy. The Museum's mission focuses not only preserving history, but also educating people. With that in mind, they offer a variety of outreach programs to area grade schools, field trips, summer camps, lectures, and a scholarship program. He will be telling us all about the Museum.

relives four decades of life in the air. Aided by his meticulously kept logbooks, he shares 94 stories, from his first flight in 1973 through his last one in 2012. Each of his eight airplanes carried him through the magical world of aviation. His home away from home over these years has been Poplar Grove Airport (C77) in Illinois, one of the best of many great general aviation airfields.

Mr. Wallem flew eight planes: a Cessna 172, two Cessna 182s, two Cessna 210s, one Cessna 170, and two Fairchild PT-19s. Each airplane taught him something different. Those lessons learned just might help you be a safer and better pilot. This book includes 23 full color photographs along with many more timeless photos, illustrations & more. Private Wings is sure to take you on a journey in an era not to be forgotten.

Merger Musings

WAR Corsair Project

This summer, a gentleman contacted Chapter 93 and said he had an aircraft project that he had started a number of years ago. He was moving and didn't want to take it with him. If we were interested in what he had, we were welcome to have it. So Rob Tweed and I saved the kit and it is currently in my hangar.

The kit is a WAR ½ scale Corsair. This is a wood kit and finished off with foam to form the shape of the fuselage. It has retracts that articulate as the full scale F4U. The items that are currently in my hangar include the fuselage that has been started, misc. hardware as well as some of the landing gear weldments. Also, it appears the full set of plans is here.
