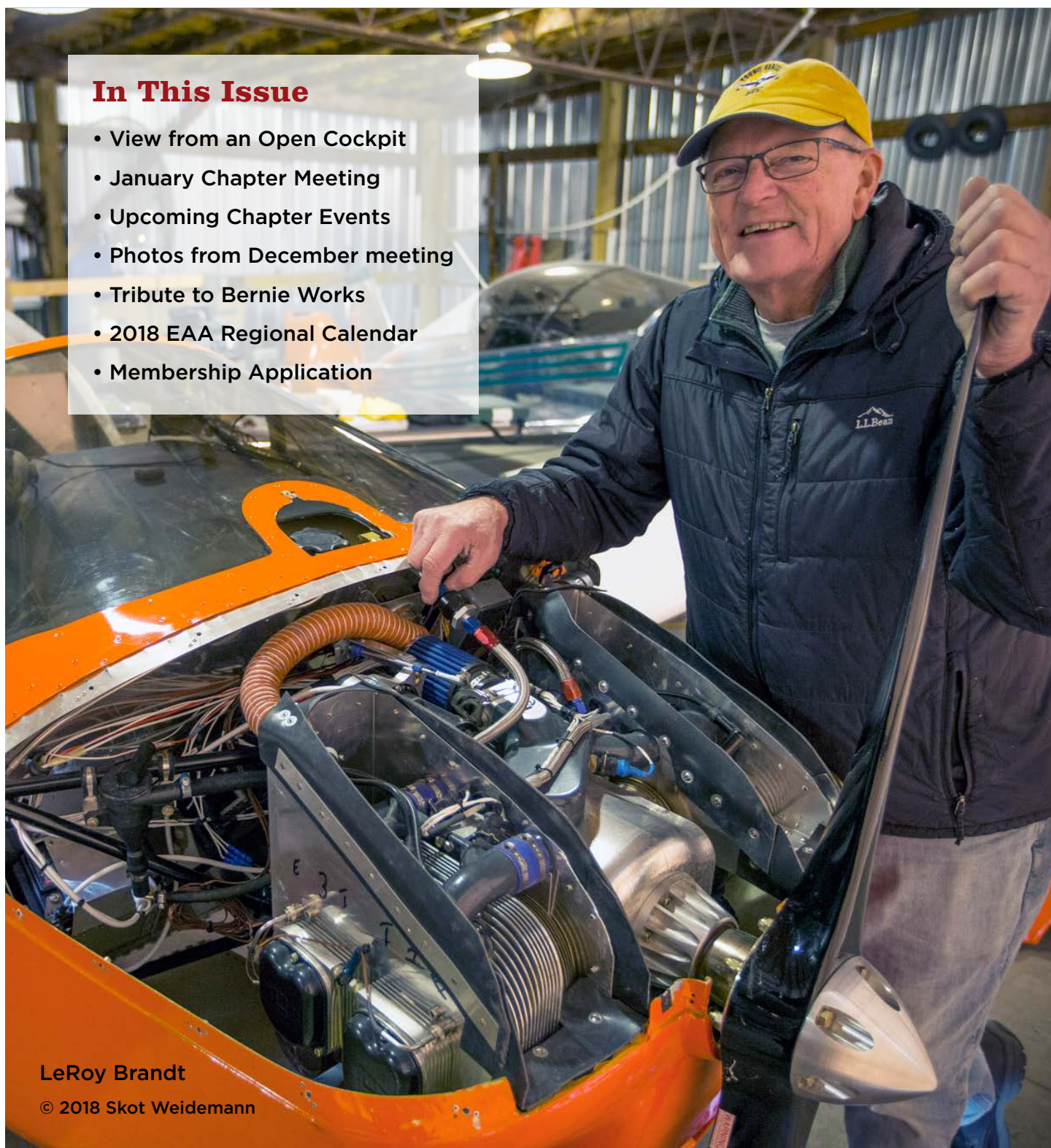

View from an Open Cockpit

WELCOME TO 2018! At our January board business meeting we spent some time discussing our 2018 chapter goals and priorities. We covered quite a few ideas and eventually narrowed the conversation down to the following items: focus on core competencies; grow membership; and grow youth outreach and involvement.

- We have achieved ability in hosting events and we want to continuously improve on our core competencies of organizing and successfully holding events such as our Pancake Breakfast, Heavy Bombers Weekend, sponsorships to Air Academy, and Young Eagle Rallies. The Madison/Middleton area community knows us because of our work and dedication to these events.
- We want to hold the gains in membership growth we have achieved (thank you Keith Doyon) and continue to grow our membership through added outreach programs such as EAA Chapter Blast to area EAA members who do not belong to a chapter, increasing our “join opportunities” with chapter sign-up tables at all our events, and expanding the distribution of our newsletter to area airports and non-chapter members.
- Youth education and involvement is critical to general aviation's and EAA's sustainability, and our ability to attract young people to aviation through Young Eagle Rallies and Air Academy sponsorships are chapter competencies. In 2018 we are expanding our youth engagement by hosting a one-day Aviation Day event for the Wisconsin Youth Company (WYC). We developed an agenda for the day that involves about twenty-five middle school students (ages 11-14) ground

school, flightline ops., YE flights, aircraft building, aviation careers, weight & balance simulations, etc. and will soon be asking for volunteers to help for the day. If successful with this year's event, we can use this as the foundation to build and expand youth engagement in future years.

In December our Planning Committee, chaired by Michelle Bailey, discussed the long-term sustainability of our chapter and its programs through infrastructure support. The committee found that we need to find skills in several critical areas from within our chapter, or from outside for-hire services. Shortly we will ask you if you have experience with:

- public & media relations (press releases, TV/radio/social media contacts, interviewing skills),
- marketing (developing brochures, writing marketing material, etc.),
- fundraising & grant writing (finding, networking, soliciting donors, writing grant proposals),
- asset management (managing and tracking of tools, furniture, office equipment, etc.),
- newsletter reporting (writing and reporting skills, editing and proofreading),
- financial management (accounting, money management, investments, etc.), or
- event organization (creating, organizing, promoting, and running flying events).

These skills are critical to our long-term sustainability and underpin our ability to expand our core competencies to deliver more aviation related events to our community. We have a few of these skills today that we need to reinforce with added help. However, many of these skills are hit-and-miss at best and need ongoing attention and support. Some of you may, as a part of your daily job or education, have these skills and we need to know who you are so that we can enlist your help.

Jeff works with Fixed Base Operators, corporate fleets, private owners, airports, and products manufacturers to provide them with risk management and insurance expertise.

He began his career with Rollins Hudig Hall in Chicago as an insurance analyst in the Research and Consulting Department, where he examined the risk management and insurance programs of a wide array of major clients and prospects. Jeff has experience with multi-national clients that have diverse operations and complex coverage needs including the oil production, construction, real estate, national

retailing, manufacturing, and aviation industries. He started the aviation practices from scratch for two other large agencies over the past 20 years prior to starting Tricor Aviation.

Jeff has attained the Chartered Property and Casualty Underwriter (CPCU) designation, Associate in Risk Management (ARM), Certified Aviation Insurance Professional (CAIP), the Accredited Advisor In Insurance (AAI), and Certified Insurance Counselor (CIC) designations. Jeff holds both a Master's and a Bachelor's degree in Risk Management and Insurance from the University of Wisconsin at Madison.

He played football for the UW as an undergraduate and was twice named to the Academic All Big Ten Team. Jeff is also an active member of the National 'W' Club and the Mendota Gridiron Club. 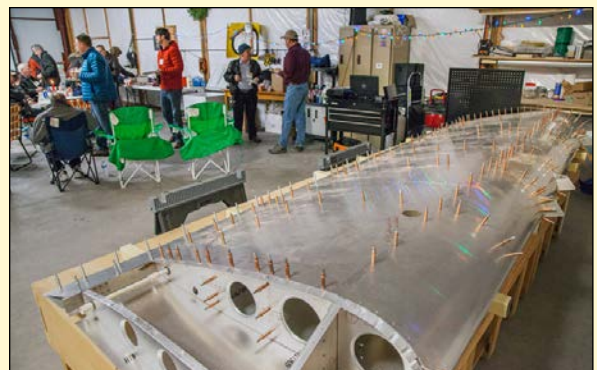

Breakfast events for many years, even on days where the weather condition or his health wasn't the best. We will miss Bernie and wish his family our sincere condolences.

Excerpts from the Cress Funeral Home website:

Bernhard (Bernie) Works, of Middleton Wisconsin passed away peacefully on Saturday, October 28th surrounded by his loving family and friends at Attic Angel Retirement Community in Middleton Wisconsin.

Born August 4th, 1925, Bernie attended Baltimore Polytechnic high school, enlisted at 17 in the Navy, learned to fly, and was honorably discharged after serving in WWII overseas. He attended the University Of Maryland and majored in Theatre where he met the love of his life Nancy McKinney. They were married September 12, 1953.

Professor Emeritus Bernhard R. Works was a member of the original planning committee for the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts. Dr. Works was Krannert's first technical director and served in that capacity until his retirement in 1993.

In his long career in technical theatre, Dr. Works designed over 200 productions in schools, colleges, community theatre, and professional summer stock. In 1980, Dr. Works received the United States Institute of Theatre Technology (USITT) title, "Fellow of the Institute."

Dr. Works and his wife of 64 years Nancy moved back to Madison Wisconsin in 2009, where he stayed active in USITT along with his second passion, aviation. Thanks to his Navy pilot training, he continued to volunteer at a local airport with the Experimental Aircraft Association's Young Eagles program where plane rides are given to young people to gain their interest in flying.
