
Jeff Russell sent out a message which I have inserted below with his permission:

A Brief History of EAA Chapter 93 1961-1995

CHAPTER PICNICS AND FLY-INS

In the early years of the chapter, picnics were a part of many monthly meetings because most of the meetings were held on Sundays and families were more involved then. Later, with chapter meetings on week-day evenings, a picnic was usually held each summer on a Sunday. The picnics were held at Van Hoofs Sod Farm, now Blackhawk Airport, near Cottage Grove.

The picnics sometimes included competitive games. While we were not able to track down all the chapter newsletters, some quotations from newsletters are listed below regarding picnics and fly-ins.

Aug. 76 Results of contests at VanHoof chapter picnic:

- First flour bombing Myron Lokken
- First powder puff flour bombing Miss Farwell
 First spot landing Allen Farwell
- Bouncing Ball trophy worst landing Bill Fobes

Sept. 77 "Picnics are always fun for any age group, but there always is additional fun when it is held with airplanes present along with enthusiastic conversation being carried on about flying, building, as well as some dreaming. This was the setting of our local chapter picnic held at Van Hoofs field Aug. 21, 1977. In spite of the rain, everyone enjoyed themselves mainly because of the generosity of Bud Rogers erecting one of his large tents as a shelter for us. Bud deserves more than just a thanks for this very thoughtful act which made this foul weather day a pleasure. In addition to Bud, we also owe many thanks to those that organized the picnic, started

the fires, furnished the tables, took care of the soft drinks etc."

(Ed. note:) The bouncing ball award will be presented at the September meeting. We didn't learn who won.

Aug. 78 "Everyone has to classify the chapter picnic a huge success with all the good food, conversations, plane rides, good weather, and Bud Rogers' generous act of lending us one of his tents again this year. A big thanks from all of us Bud. Let's not forget Van for the use of his field, we sure would be in bad shape without his generosity. The people that erected the tent, took care of the equipment, fires, etc. should be remembered too."

For several years when fly-ins were organized for fund raising the weather guru was nasty to us. Rain, fog, or howling winds often prevailed. The writer remembers one fly-in that was warm and sunny, but with a south wind that kept the wind sock horizontal and perpendicular to the runway all day. Otis Lokken flew his Aeronca Champ in from Stoughton that day. He also gave a ride to one of the Madison TV station camera men and made the evening news.

April 87 Tom Steele and Jay Monroe arranged for permission to hold the chapter fly-in at Blackhawk Airport September 13.

Aug. 88 "The fly-in breakfast that we have scheduled for Sept. 11, 1988 is taking shape nicely. Our fly-in chairman is a tad concerned that she hasn't heard from more people. If you can't make it to the meeting, please give Kathy Monahan a call."

March 89 "Our annual Fly-In Breakfast is scheduled for Sept. 10, 1989 at the Blackhawk Airport, Cottage Grove." (Ed. note:) the Sept. Fly-In was later cancelled.

May 92 "Annual Chapter 93 picnic, mtg. June 27, Blackhawk Field 3 P.M." "Chapter 93 Fly-In Morey Field, Aug. 30."

July 92 "Plans for our Fly-In for Aug. 30 are coming along nicely." "The Fly-In Co-Chairs Jeff Plantz and Tom Rebholz say of the Fly-In, BE THERE!"

Sept. 93 "Our Brat-Bean-Feed Fly-In got wet again. However, we didn't do all bad. A fair number of folks drove in, so we came out OK money-wise." "A special thanks to Jeff Nelson for serving as Chairman for this event. A big Thank You to all others who helped. We'll do better next year."

Sept. 94 "By all accounts our 94 Fly-In was a success. The weather turned out just about perfect."

"A special thanks to Jeff Nelson for doing a great job as Chairman of the event."

Sept. 95 "To all of you who pitched in and made the Fly-In a success, give yourselves a pat on the back, the Weatherman, maybe NOT. Considering the weather, we did very well. It appears we could be starting a tradition here. Our publicity people did a fantastic job in getting the word out."

"We extend a heartfelt thanks to Bob Mackey, EAA Chapter Executive Director/Corporate Risk Manager for being with us for the dedication of our new Chapter Meeting Room/Young Eagles Center at the Brat Bean-Feed Fly-In on Sunday, August 27, 1995. EAA Founder and Chairman of the Board, Paul Poberezny, wasn't able to make it. However, Bob brought his family with him so that was special. Thanks very much Bob, you're welcome to join us any time."
